

The worker's assembly of the Herbusa company has agreed to call an indefinite strike starting on Friday, June 28th at 2:30 a.m., that is, the early hours of Thursday to Friday. This strike will affect waste collection and street and beach cleaning services throughout the municipality of Santa Eulària des Riu.

The City Council does not have a voice in the negotiation, which is being carried out between the workers and the company, but as the Administration responsible for the municipality's waste collection and street cleaning service, minimum services have been established for both waste collection and for street and beach cleaning.

From the City Council we appreciate your understanding and request your collaboration in order to face the possible consequences that may arise due to the limitations in the cleaning and waste management services if the strike ends up going ahead. Therefore, the following recommendations are transferred:

- Reduce waste generation to the maximum during the strike period and correctly recycle all recyclable waste fractions.

- Guarantee optimal separation of the organic fraction, for which higher collection frequencies have been planned in order to avoid health problems. Keep this fraction stored in cold rooms for as long as possible.

- Fold and press the cardboard into the containers in order to optimize the available space.

- Keep the containers inside the facilities until collection time, delaying the time as much as possible, and always before 2.30am.

- Remove containers from public roads and take them in before 9 am.

- Do not use, under any circumstances, containers on public roads, they are intended for citizens and small businesses use.

- Ensure the cleanliness of public access areas.

On the other hand, it is reported that the collection frequencies planned with the minimum services are the following:

Light packaging THURSDAY

Paper-cardboard MONDAY

Glass THURSDAY
